Inspirational words (Luke chapter 2)

A Savior has been born

- Joseph and Mary went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Bethlehem. They were to be there for a census that was to be taken. vv. 1-5
- When the time came for Christ's birth, there was no place for them in the inn, yet Mary bore her firstborn son, despite being in the occupied world. vv. 6-7
 - Wrapped Him in swaddling clothes (confined, humanity).
 - Laid Him in a manger (satisfied and trusting whatever God arranged).
 - * Those two signs were given to the shepherds, for them to find Him. v. 12

Seekers found Him

- There were shepherds in the fields. v. 8
 - An angel announced to them good news of great joy, **"Today a Savior has been born to you**."
 - He is Christ the Lord.
 - "Let us go to Bethlehem and see ... ", a seeking heart. v. 15
 - Seek, you shall find. The shepherds came in haste and found Him. v. 16

Humanity and commission

- The Savior came in full humanity
 - \cdot $\;$ Was circumcised according to the law. v. 21 $\;$
 - Was called Jesus, the name given by the angel. v. 21
 - · Was presented. vv. 23-24
 - · Was adored. v. 28
 - The little child grew and was filled with wisdom and grace. v. 40
 - · Heard and questioned the teachers in the temple. v. 46
- "I must be in the things of My Father." v. 49

Our findings

- What is recorded in the "Gospel of Luke" is the <u>completeness and perfection of His</u> <u>humanity.</u>
- This book stresses the Lord as the <u>Man-Savior</u> based on the moral principles that apply to all men.
- We have a Savior who is both the <u>Son of God</u> and the <u>Son of man</u>. He is one hundred percent of God and one hundred percent of man, **the Man-Savior**.
- As the Man-Savior, He was born in a very significant environment.
 - At the roadside or at a crossroad to reach people.
 - Being wrapped with swaddling clothes confined as a man.
 - Was laid in the manger obedient, restful and trusting in the God-arranged place.
- As a man, "... He might taste death on behalf of everything" (Heb 2:9). "For being tempted in that which He Himself has suffered; He is able to help those who are being tempted" (Heb 2:18).
- Like Him, we must be **in the things of our Father**.
