Curing the dying one (vv. 1-10)

- In Capernaum, a centurion sent some elders of the Jews, requesting Jesus to come to heal his slave who was about to die.
- The centurion recognized the authority of the Lord; he requested Jesus to speak a word and let the slave be healed. Jesus granted the healing on such a great **faith**.

Showing pity (vv. 11-17)

- In Nain, a widow's only son died. When the Lord saw her, He was moved with compassion. He came, touched the bier, and said, "Young man, to you I say, Arise."
- He was brought back to life.
- People saw this; they feared and glorified God. "God has visited His people."

Strengthening His forerunner (vv. 18-35)

- John sent two of his disciples to ask Jesus, "Are you the coming One?" Jesus answered by sending them back to testify what they had seen and heard:
 - · The blind receive their sight
 - · The lame walk
 - · The lepers are cleansed
 - · The deaf hear
 - · The dead are raised
 - · The poor have the gospel announced to them
- Blessed is he who is not stumbled because of Me
- John was sent as a messenger before the Lord
 - "Among those born of women there is **no one greater than John**, yet **he who is** least in the kingdom of God is greater than he."

Forgiving sinners (vv. 36-50)

- Jesus entered a Pharisee's house and ate there.
- A woman, a sinner, brought an alabaster flask of ointment. She wept at Jesus' feet,
 kissed His feet, and anointed them with the ointment.
- Jesus said, "Her sins which are many are forgiven, because she loved much ..."
- Jesus is the One who has authority to forgive.
- "Your faith has saved you. Go in peace."
